


## Surprise Circle Window Card – Class 21 - 2022



This weeks card has a shaped centrepiece on the front that turns out to be a folding feature on the inside of the card.

### SUPPLIES

QTY	PRODUCT	MEASUREMENT	DESCRIPTION
1	Card Base	14.8cm x 21cm (A5) (5 <sup>7</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " x 8 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>4</sub> " )	Folded in half to make an A6 card base. The example is a white coloured card base
1	Patterned Paper	14.3cm x 10cm Metric Rectangle 2 (5 <sup>5</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " x 4 inches)	Any patterned paper will work
1	Coloured Cardstock	Approx. 8cm x 8cm (3 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " x 3 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " )	This is to cut the shape for the centrepiece of our card so choose a piece that co-ordinates with your patterned paper
1	Coloured Cardstock	Approx. 3.5cm x 8cm (1 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " x 3 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " )	This is the 'hinge' piece to hold our centrepiece into place. You can use white as in the example or the same colour as your centrepiece
	Cardstock	Scraps – around 6cm x 6cm	These pieces will be used to cut circles for the centrepiece – the white piece on the front that the gnome is on and on the back of this piece to help secure and cover the 'hinge'. You will also need some for your greeting.
	Embellishment		Carol has used one of the cutest gnomes that is on the stamp set this month, but you can use whatever you have in your stash
	Bling		Well, every card deserves bling.

### FROM YOUR STASH

#### CONSUMABLES

- Glue / double sided tape
- Double sided foam tape or cardboard
- Ink – for the greeting

#### TOOLS

- Scissors
- Bone folder
- Shaped dies – I used circles
- Die Cutting machine
- Stamp platform or block
- Greeting stamp
