


## <u>Surprise Circle Window Card – Class 21 - 2022</u>







This weeks card has a shaped centrepiece on the front that turns out to be a folding feature on the inside of the card.

	Cardstock	Scraps – around 6cm x 6cm	These pieces will be used to cut circles for the centrepiece – the		
			white piece on the front that the gnome is on and on the back
