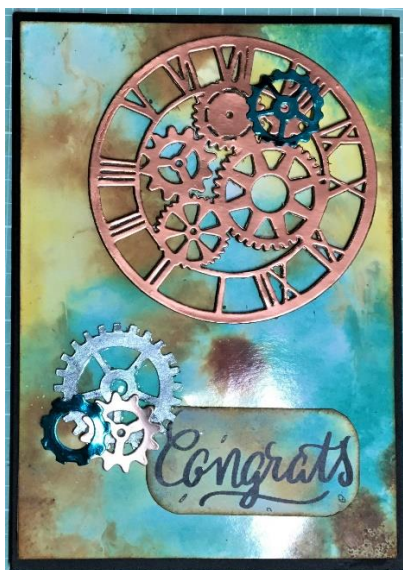


A Little Bit of Mixed Media – Class 29 - 2022



SUPPLIES

QTY	PRODUCT	A6 CARD	DESCRIPTION
2	Card Base	14.8cm x 21cm (A5) (5 7/8" x 8 1/4")	Both sample cards have black card bases
2	Photo Paper / Card	14.8cm x 10.5cm Metric Rectangle 1 (5 7/8" x 4 1/4")	This is what we will be doing our background technique on. There are two A5 sheets in the kit – I just cut mine in half to A6 size to make the background
1	Card Stock	14.8cm x 10.5cm Metric Rectangle 1 (5 7/8" x 4 1/4")	We will be using this as a guide for our background technique
	Ephemera	A mixture of cogs, clock – anything that you have really. Both cards have the large clock base die cut from the kit and some smaller ones as well. I cut my large clock from the metallic card that comes with the paper pack this month, but you can use plain kraft coloured card if you wish. I also cut out some smaller cogs from some of the scraps from last months kit. Carol made the second card (clearly the better example of mixed media) and she also added some hessian, string, some washi tape and some black ribbon. This is the best time to use up anything that you have around the place.	
	Greetings		I believe Carol Stamped her greeting and I used one from the kit.
	White Card	Scraps	To stamp your greeting on – we will also colour it to match the background

CONSUMABLES

- Glue / double sided tape
- Double sided foam tape or cardboard
- Ink – I used distress oxides and the distress vintage photo to make my background and I believe that Carol used all distress inks. You can use standard die inks or paints.
- Water in spray bottle
- Baby Wipes
- Metallic paints (if you have some)

TOOLS

- Scissors
- Bone folder
- Greeting Stamps
- Die Cutter
- Dies
- Heat tool OR hair dryer
- Paint Brush or water brush
- Minimum A4 piece of acetate or large piece of flat cellophane.
- Sponge Daubers / foam / cotton balls
