


# **Little Box of Cards**





### **SUPPLIES**

QTY	PRODUCT	MEASUREMENT	DESCRIPTION
1	350gsm Cardstock	20cm x 25cm	This piece is for the base
1	350gsm Cardstock	17.3cm x 22.3cm	This is for the lid of our box
1	Patterned paper	16.8cm x 11.8cm	This is for the top of the lid. NOTE: I used 6" x 6" paper from the same paper pad used in the cards, so I added a strip on one edge — you could add a contrasting strip at the top and the bottom or use a larger piece of patterned paper
2	Patterned paper	16.8cm x 2cm	These are for the long sides of the lid – once again, if using 6" x 6" paper, you will need to add a small piece.
2	Patterned paper	11.8cm x 2cm	These are for the short sides of the lid.
	Ephemera / label		What ever you want to decorate your box.

# **FROM YOUR STASH**

# **CONSUMABLES**

- Glue
- Double-sided tape

### **TOOLS**

- Paper trimmer
- Scoreboard OR ruler and stylus
- Bone folder

#### **ADDITIONAL NOTES:**

- 1. Score the larger piece of cardstock (this will be the bottom of the box) at 4cm from each edge.
- 2. Score the smaller piece of cardstock (this will be the lid of the box) at 2.5cm from each edge.
- 3. Fold and burnish each score with a bone folder.
- 4. On the long side of the bottom piece, cut along the short fold line from the edge to where the fold lines meet. This will create small flaps.
- 5. Repeat this for the lid piece.
- 6. Adhere the patterned papers to the top and sides of the lid each piece will be positioned to allow a small border of the cardboard to be seen. There is no patterned paper on the flaps that we created in the previous step.
- 7. Fold the cardstock into a box shape by adding glue to the flaps and adhering on the inside make a nice crisp corner. Repeat this for all corners of the top and the bottom of the box.
- 8. Add any decorations or greeting on the top and fill your box with A6 cards and envelopes.
